



**BASIC FACTS & FIGURES:**

**NONPROFIT COMMUNITY HOSPITALS<sup>1</sup>**

- There are 2,904 nonprofit community hospitals in the U.S., representing 58% percent of the total number of community hospitals and about 74% of all privately owned community hospitals.<sup>2</sup> State and local governments own 21% of community hospitals and private investors own 20%. These figures have changed very little over the past four years.

- The distribution of beds by ownership status has also remained stable over time. 69% of beds are nonprofit, 15% are government, and 15% are for-profit.

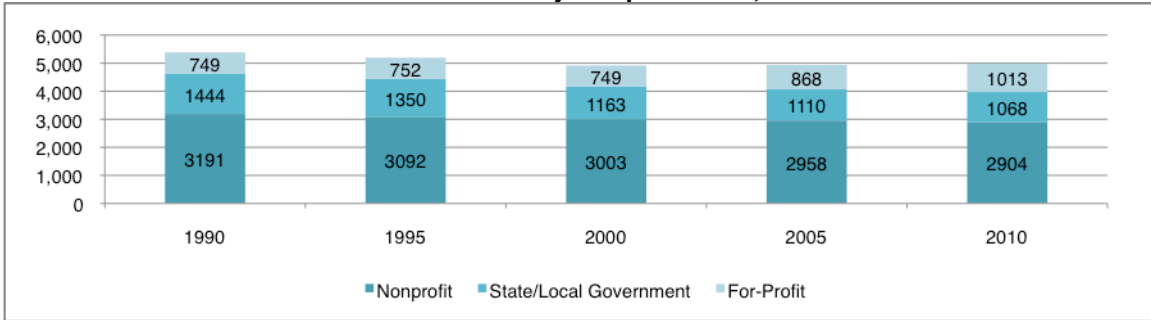

<sup>2</sup> Total U.S. hospitals, 5,754, include all those registered with the American Hospital Association and meeting its criteria for registration as a hospital facility. The break-out by type is 4,985 community hospitals, 213 federal government hospitals, 435 nonfederal psychiatric hospitals, 111 nonfederal long term care hospitals, and 10 hospital units of institutions (e.g., prison, college infirmaries).

- Nonprofit community hospitals tend to be more heavily represented in the following geographic regions: New England, Mid-Atlantic and East North Central (i.e., Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Wisconsin). The individual states with the largest percentage of nonprofit hospitals are Rhode Island and Vermont.
- State and local government community hospitals are most heavily represented in the West North Central region (i.e., Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota). The individual states with the largest percentage of government hospitals are Wyoming and Iowa.
- For-profit community hospitals are most heavily represented in the West South Central region (i.e., Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas). The individual states with the largest percentage of for-profit hospitals are Florida and Nevada.
